WRAPPING UP THE FAIRFIELD-BROOKFIELD AREA COMBINED SEWER SEPARATION PROJECT

In November, construction crews wrapped up major construction for the Fairfield-Brookfield Area Combined Sewer Separation Project. Originally scheduled as a three-year project, construction crews were able to finish in two years, one year ahead of schedule. This early completion was thanks to the residents' patience and cooperation with the project. Avon Lake Regional Water would like to extend a thank you to all the residents in the area.

The Fairfield-Brookfield Area Combined Sewer Separation Project is a \$44,000 investment per home, financed by a loan through the Ohio EPA's Revolving Loan Fund with \$9.5 million being at a 0% interest rate. Receiving the 0% interest rate saved customers \$1.8 million in wastewater rates and \$1.1 million in City of Avon Lake taxes.

The lateral separation deadline for homes in the Fairfield-Brookfield Area Combined Sewer Separation Project and Curtis Drive is February 1, 2019. 💧

CREWS BEGIN THE 45 AREA COMBINED SEWER SEPARATION PROJECT

On October 30, 2017, construction crews began The 45 Area Combined Sewer Separation Project. This two-year project is a \$53,000 investment per home to separate the combined sanitary and storm sewers. Separating the combined sewer will reduce the amount of discharge into Lake Erie during heavy rain events. Not only will the area receive new sanitary and storm sewers, but new water lines, storm water catch basins, lateral connections, tree lawn restoration, and roadway enhancement with restoration.

Avon Lake Regional Water received financing by the Ohio EPA Revolving Loan Fund with \$3.5 million at a 0% interest rate. Receiving this interest rate will save over \$1.2 million in savings for our customers (\$750,000 in wastewater rates and \$500,000 in City of Avon Lake taxes).

Separate Lateral Loan Billing Available To Avon Lake Landlords

In October, the Avon Lake Board of Municipal Utilities modified the Lateral Loan Program to allow for the ability to separately bill Avon Lake landlords for a lateral loan and for the landlords to receive the \$1000 credit on that bill for performing the lateral separation to that property.
