## <u>Item 5</u>: Reschedule of July Meeting

The Board's July meeting is currently scheduled for July 4, 2017. As this is a holiday, it is requested the Board reschedule the meeting, potentially to July 11, 2017.

## Recommended Motion:

I move to reschedule the July regular meeting to July 11, 2017.

## <u>Item 6</u>: New Laborer Job Descriptions – TAD

As presented at the January 17, 2017, work session, management created a new position of "Laborer" in the Distribution and Collection Department and renamed the existing "Laborer" position as a "Skilled Laborer" with minor changes. The CUE requests their approval and is working with the union to finalize the wage steps.

The Principles that would help guide the Board are:

- Sustain an empowered, skilled, quality workforce with a commitment to innovation.
- Exercise fiduciary responsibility.

## Recommended Motion:

I move to approve the Laborer and Skilled Laborer job descriptions.

## <u>Item 7</u>: Establishing the Customer Service Clerk Wage Steps – TAD

Last fall, the Board approved a job description and proposed wage range for the Customer Service Clerk. As set forth in the collective bargaining agreement, the CUE met with the union to then negotiate the rate. (As a note, the CUE realizes this method of meeting first with the Board and then the union to negotiate seems out of order and is being modified for other positions.) Through negotiation, the union and the CUE agreed upon the following wage steps below, pending Board approval. The top two wage steps remain unchanged from what the Board approved last fall. The bottom wage step begins at \$14.00/hr, rather than the \$12.00/hr originally proposed to the Board. The original wage steps were proposed by the CUE to reflect the customer service market wages. During the negotiation, the CUE also looked at market wages for bookkeeping clerks. The higher initial wages would be supported when also considering those responsibilities.

The Principles that would help guide the Board are:

- Sustain an empowered, skilled, quality workforce with a commitment to innovation.
- Exercise fiduciary responsibility.

### Recommended Motion:

I move to set the wage steps for Customer Service Clerk as follows:

## <u>Item 8A1: Employee Promotion – TAD</u>

Donald Hall was hired as a Laborer on May 4, 2015 and, per his direct supervisor, has provided exceptional service performing all the tasks required of him and has received his Class I Distribution license. With recommendation from his supervisor, the CUE concurs with the promotion of Donald Hall from Laborer Step 1C to Line Maintenance Man Step 1C (the next higher step). It was originally intended that Mr. Hall would receive a step increase in April. This promotion will be in lieu of the increase. By inclusion as an information item, the Board will recognize the promotion and wage change.

## <u>Item 8A2</u>: **Contract Update** – *TAD*

During 2016, MWH Americas was purchased by Stantec. The CUE recently executed on the Board's behalf an assignment of the current MWH Americas contract to Stantec.

## <u>Item 8A3</u>: **Job Description Updates** – *TAD*

The CUE and senior staff continue to work both internally and with the HR Director on updates to job descriptions, including the redefining of the Executive Assistant and the GIS Analyst into new positions, and the rewriting of other new job descriptions. The CUE and senior staff are also negotiating any potential wage changes with the union so that fewer issues should arise after the CUE seeks Board approval.

## <u>Item 8A4</u>: **Phone System Updates** – *TAD*

Staff is in the process of updating the phone system to include an auto-attendant. In order to best manage the increased phone calls due to the lateral separations and the construction projects and also allow the front-office staff to focus on other responsibilities, the auto attendant will help direct calls to the appropriate personnel.

## Item 8A5: **Potential Appropriation** – *TAD*

In late-2016, OWDA forwarded an approximate \$130,000 invoice to Avon Lake Regional Water for loan origination fees regarding the water pollution control center rehabilitation project. For OWDA projects, origination fees are usually rolled into the loan. However, because the rehabilitation project was funded using state revolving loan funds, the fees must be paid separately. These fees were neglected to be budgeted in the 2017 Wastewater Fund operating budget. The Board will see them in the February 21, 2017, expenses. Around the end of the third quarter, the CUE will assess whether additional funds need to be appropriated to help pay for these expenses.

## Item 8A6: Lost Time Incident – SCB

Line Maintenance Operator Dennis Knick was working on a ladder about five feet above the ground at the Water Filtration Plant on January 25, 2017. The ladder leg broke, causing Dennis to fall to the concrete. As a result of the fall, bones in Mr. Knick's heel and two fingers were broken. We are glad his injuries were not more severe and look forward to having him return to work. The ladder has been destroyed so that it cannot be used again.

## <u>Item 8A7</u>: **Project Updates** – *SCB*

Water Tower: Initial tank bowl welding has begun for the bottom cone section. In order to make up lost time, crews are currently working seven days per week.

Water Plant: Continuing with the wash water recycling system and attenuation basins.

Wastewater Plant: Will provide verbal update.

## <u>Item 8A8</u>: Lateral Loan Program – TAD

Since the last Board meeting, three additional agreement for the Lateral Loan Program has been executed, bringing the total to 34 properties, with \$109,400 (total) committed and \$28,550 paid so far. The average loan request is for approximately \$3,200.

## Item 8A9: **CUE Action Items** – *TAD*

Below are responses to questions asked by the Board:

Debrief on how CMAR worked on the water project: As the project approaches substantial completion in March or April, staff will provide a synopsis regarding how well the construction manager at risk approach worked.

LORCO FPAs: LORCO is currently discussing with Elyria the potential for minor FPA boundary adjustments where one entity may be better able to provide service than the other. The process is proceeding congenially.

The work session was called to order at 6:00 PM.

Present: Mr. Dzwonczyk, Mr. Rickey, Mr. Rush, and Mrs. Schnabel.

Also present: WPCC Manager Baytos and CUE Danielson.

## Part-Time/Temporary Help

Board members recently requested better definition regarding the various types of part-time positions employed by Avon Lake Regional Water. The CUE presented draft definitions for "seasonal help," "interns," and "part-time employees." Members generally concurred with the definitions and wanted to assure that the HR Director was also comfortable with them. The CUE agreed he would speak with the HR Director and indicated he wanted the Board's concurrence on this item before he worked with the HR Director.

## New Laborer Job Descriptions

The CUE stated that as part of the review of all job descriptions within Avon Lake Regional Water, he and management staff identified that a few of the departments needed new entry-level positions. The Distribution and Collection Department is one that does, and a draft of a new "Laborer" Job description was presented, along with a revised job description for "Skilled Laborer," which is a minor re-write to the old "Laborer" description. The CUE indicated that the HR Committee had no comments on the descriptions and would move them forward to the Council for approval. The CUE further indicated that he would present them to the Civil Service Commission on February 2, 2017, for agreement that the new position was classified. The CUE stated he would be meeting with the union before the next Board meeting, where he would seek the Board's approval for the descriptions.

## Inspectors

The CUE informed the Board that he has been investigating long-term options for inspection of water line and sewer construction projects and needs to investigate more alternatives before he presents any recommendations.

## **Executive Assistant**

Due to potential concern that the Council would not fix the Executive Assistant wage range established by the Board, the CUE decided to update the job description to better reflect the actual intended financial duties that would be undertaken by the person filling that role. The CUE and the Board further discussed what the role may entail, and consensus was achieved that the role would include several aspects similar to a financial analyst and one that could take over financial responsibilities in the CUE's

absence. With that, the CUE indicated he would write a new description that reflected the revised scope and work with the HR Director regarding roles and wages.

## Other Business

Members indicated that they had not been briefed by management lately regarding the various projects and priorities of each department. After brief discussion, the CUE indicated that he would invite them to speak at an upcoming work session in the spring and then also have them attend as draft budgets are being discussed in the fall.

The work session adjourned at 7:17 PM.

## Call to Order - Roll Call

The meeting was called to order at 7:24 PM.

Present: Mr. Dzwonczyk, Mr. Rush, Mr. Rickey, and Mrs. Schnabel.

Also present: Chief Utilities Executive Danielson, WPCC Manager Baytos.

## Approve Minutes

Chairman Dzwonczyk presented the minutes of the December 20, 2016 Work Session and Regular Meeting, the January 3, 2017 Regular Meeting, and the January 10, 2017 Work Session and with no changes, additions or corrections noted, ordered the minutes to stand and be distributed as presented.

## Public Speakers - None.

**Correspondence** – CUE Danielson reported he is trying to reach out to Mr. Hook who had questions on his last bill.

Ms. Schnabel moved and Mr. Rush seconded to appoint C. J. Tyree to fill the vacant Board position with a term expiring December 31, 2019. Mr. Dzwonczyk requested a roll call vote.

Mr. Rickey moved and Mr. Dzwonczyk seconded to appoint Randy Phillps to fill the vacant Board position with a term expiring December 31, 2019.

## Reports/Updates

Chemical Optimization Study: Staff has reviewed and provided comments to the consultant regarding the draft corrosion control study. As was expected, even though Avon Lake Regional Water is meeting all public health standards regarding lead and copper, addition of a phosphate-based corrosion inhibitor is recommended for optimal corrosion control. While the report is being finalized, staff is working separately to develop a design-build RFP to install a phosphate-based corrosion inhibition system.

ETL1 Variable Frequency Drives: The VFDs for ETL1 were rebuilt in 2010 and 2013. They are now outdated and will be replaced before failure. This was discussed with ETL1 customers at the annual consortium meeting. Staff will develop bidding documents and seek award at a future meeting.

ETL2 Pumps: The three ETL2 pumps are inadequate to keep up with increasing demand (Medina County, Medina City, new Avon tower, and RLCWA). We intend to install a fourth pump and are developing bidding documents. This was discussed with ETL2 customers at the annual consortium meeting. Staff will seek award at a future meeting.

## Project Updates:

Water Tower: Done with pedestal concrete, working on internal equipment including mechanical.

Water Plant: Moving into the wash water recycling system and attenuation basins. Wastewater Plant: HVAC installed, headworks junction chamber and next 14 foot lift going in, final tank backfill, alum tank leak test complete, mechanical going in in alum tank, administration building rough-in with drywall and electrical, will start bypass of UV system next week.

Promotion of Adam Sisson: As a result of a recent retirement in the Distribution and Collection Department, an internal opening was posted for a new Laborer. Management interviewed candidates and promoted Adam Sisson, WFP Operator (Step 1C) to Laborer (Step 4, the next higher step) effective 1/9/17.

Lateral Loan Program: Since the last Board meeting, three additional agreements for the Lateral Loan Program have been executed, bringing the total to 31 properties, with \$99,400 (total) committed and \$20,550 paid so far. The average loan request is for approximately \$3,200.

Lateral Separation Update: As of January 12, 2017, 2,914 letters have been sent to residents indicating that they may have clean water entering their sanitary lateral and requesting Avon Lake Regional Water be contacted to determine whether this may be the case. Currently, 1,796 (62%) have responded (up approximately 38 last month). Of the 1,796, 1,230 have either separated laterals or already had separated laterals and 566 either have problems or are believed to have problems. By extrapolation, approximately 1,200 (566 + ~60% of homes not inspected) may need to separate laterals.

## Cleveland Construction Cost Index:

By Ordinance the Trunk Sanitary Sewer Fee is adjusted annually corresponding to a change in the January Cleveland Construction Cost Index. The adjustment to the Trunk Sanitary Sewer Fee is calculated by comparing the Index published in January each year and multiplying that comparison by the current Trunk Sanitary Sewer Fee. The Index published January 11, 2017 was 12267.85 as compared to 11895.69 for 2016, an increase of 3.13%. The Board thereby recognized the following adjustments then effective and, accordingly, the respective adjustments for the existing sanitary sewer front foot fees, the CALDP Tap in Fee, Commercial Square Foot Charge, and Water Impact Fee:

Why so much overtime for the pay period 12/12/16 to 12/25/16: As is often the case, there are several causes for overtime. For the pay period in question, below is a table explaining overtime in more detail:

Should expenses for the Elyria interconnect be capitalized: CUE Danielson reported consulting expenses for the Elyria emergency interconnection are paid through the operating budget, and are generally capitalized for accounting purposes.

Rebuilding the WPCC video status: The current intention for the video is to make it into a "before and after" video. Raw footage has been collected. Some on-going construction footage will be captured, and then final footage will be taken when the project is complete.

Proceeding with ISO9000: Staff is preparing to reach out to consultants regarding quality management programs.

Dave Rickey would like an updated LORCO spreadsheet: CUE Danielson provided the LORCO spreadsheet for the Board's information.

What have we done to minimize future over-pressurization: CUE Danielson reported staff will be working with integrators to determine how to best link and analyze the pressure data from the two WFP locations and whether additional backup sensors are advisable.

Brown and Caldwell synopsis re the 45s: A draft technical memorandum was submitted January 12, 2017. The report suggests that separation, possibly with additional storage, is still the best approach. Staff will review the memorandum in detail in the upcoming days.

SPCC for 5,000 gal diesel tank: Staff has reached out to regulators to assure that the correct documentation is completed.

Medical Mutual Billing: Per the Finance Department, Avon Lake is self-insured. Monthly payments are the standard feed for insurance. Weekly payments vary based upon weekly doctor visits/medication costs/etc.

What are we doing to harden SCADA? The paperwork has been started to allow the Department of Homeland Security to complete a physical and virtual audit of our facilities.

Chairman/Committee/Members Reports

Chairman Dzwonczyk reported he attended last week's Sewer Committee Meeting during which there was extensive discussion on the Sewer Separation Project.

Mr. Rush reported he will attend the Human Resources Committee Meeting.

CUE Report

CUE Danielson reported that although Avon Lake Regional Water has become more resilient, frazil ice was detected on the air burst system, but after modifying the burst cycle, we were able to get back to normal operations. As a precautionary measure, divers removed the access port plate to assure water would keep flowing.

Attached is a draft job description for the new Analyst/Assistant position. This is a major modification to the position originally described as an Executive Assistant. The position would be responsible for providing financial analysis regarding revenues and expenses, projects and debt, operations, "what-if" scenarios, and a variety of other areas. The position would create "dashboards," perform budgeting tasks, and oversee financial duties at the CUE's direction. The position would also perform administrative functions such as preparing Board packages and creating minutes, record keeping and filling, and handling information requests.

As with many positions in small companies, the position is a hybrid: comprising approximately 70% Financial Analyst and 30% Executive Assistant. As such, the proposed wage range is a blend of the two. The Bureau of Labor Statistics states that the May 2015 wages for Financial Analysts in our area was \$50,000 to \$96,000 for the 10<sup>th</sup> to 75<sup>th</sup> percentiles and the wage range for Executive Assistant was \$33,000 to \$60,000 for the 10<sup>th</sup> to 75<sup>th</sup> percentiles. Therefore, I believe an appropriate wage range would be \$40,000 to \$80,000 per year as a salary. This range should attract the right type of people for the duties we wish the position to perform.
